How the world has changed in the last few weeks. I suspect things will never be quite the same again.

Dealing with the here and now the key for the charity sector is survival. Whilst charities can take steps to cut costs by for example furloughing staff, there is no immediate answer to the huge impact on fundraising income.

A survey carried out by the Institute of Fundraising shows a 42% demand for charity services but a 48% decline in voluntary income. 83% of those surveyed state that the key to sustainability is access to emergency grant funding. I can only hope that in the next few days this is forthcoming.
